Housing for All Mission :

- Simplify procedure for non-agriculture areas for residential purpose
- Earmark areas for affordable housing in Master Plans
- Ensure single-window and time bound layout building permission
- Introduce system of deemed building permission for preapproved layouts and building plans for EWS/LIG housing
- Amend rental laws and Provide additional FSI/TDR and density for slum redevelopment schemes
- HOUSING FOR ALL AND SWACHCH BHARAT MISSION HAVE FOCUS ON INCLUSIVE PLANNING



ARCHITECTURE AND URBAN PLANNING ISSUES

- Need for Market-Oriented Architecture Design and Development Plans
- Impact of ICT Not Fully Known
- Link with Public Health Missing
- Limited Capacity at All Levels
- Limited Understanding of how to Make Cities Inclusive

- B. Plan and B Arch in SPA Delhi
- M. Plan (Urban) in SPA Delhi and SPA Bhopal
- B. Plan and M. Arch (Urban Design) in SPA Bhopal
- INFORMAL SETTLEMENTS COVER ONLY 5% in ARCHITECTURE AND 10-15% PLANNING COURSES
- Students can take electives and thesis projects on inclusive issues



B. Plan Course SPA Delhi: 2016

- Prepare Professionals to Contribute to Society and to Provide Knowledge to Disadvantaged Groups
- Impart Knowledge towards Creating Safe and Just society (land allocation, implementation, etc.)
- Theory: Semester II: Social Science, Semester IV; Planning Theory, Semester V: Housing Settlement Society (Only 7.5 out of total 150 credits theory)
- Semester V and VI Studios Focus on Informal Settlements
- Electives and Thesis are Optional.



GLOBAL STUDIO 2012 BHOPAL

- Focus of the Studio on Imparting Inclusive Planning Education through Participatory Learnings
- Studio Included:
 - Housing Inclusive Planning for Poor
 - Inclusive City Center
 - School Plus Project
- These Activities included invovlement of students with community
- Community helped to understand functional needs, affordability, applicability of solutions, etc.



CHANGING FOCUS OF THE COURSES 1

- Most Students want Skills that Give Access to Jobs
- In the Societal Context, High Paying Jobs are the Indicators of Success
- Changing course curriculum is very long and time consuming process. Will require support of AICTE, COA, UGC, ITPI, etc.
