Expected rapid urbanization, entailing massive rural to urban migration when there is already a massive housing stress in India, is expected to create informal settlements with appalling living conditions. India requires a cadre of differently trained architects and urban planners who can address the situation of poverty, informality and diversity of affected populations. Sustainable Development Goals will require urban planners, designers and architects to rise to this challenge.
